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# 1 Standards for Content of Governmental Unit and Legal Entity Boundaries

# 2 1.1 Objective

- 3 The purpose of this standard is to establish content of geospatial base data that are consistent for all
- 4 governmental unit and legal entity boundaries maintained by the U.S. Geological Survey for the
- 5 Boundaries data theme of *The National Map*. It establishes content requirements for collection and
- 6 archival, and facilitates exchange and maintenance of geospatial boundary data.

# 7 **1.2 Scope**

- 8 This standard describes the base geographic content maintained in a national database of boundary data
- 9 for the United States and its Outlying Areas for *The National Map*.

# 10 1.3 Applicability

- 11 This standard is applicable to the data stored and maintained by the U.S Geological Survey, Geography
- Discipline, as the Boundaries data theme of *The National Map*.

# 10 **1.8 Definitions**

- 11 The following definitions apply to this standard:
- 12 **Governmental Unit** A legally bounded geographic entity that has the authority of a government. A
- legal government is one established under Federal, State, tribal, or local law with the authority to elect or
- 14 appoint officials and raise revenues through taxes.
- 15 **Legal Entity** A geographic unit with legally defined boundaries established under Federal, State, tribal,
- or local law as an area for the administration of a governmental function.

# 1 2 Boundary Data Content

- 2 The features on the following pages compose content of the geospatial base data for all governmental unit
- and legal entity boundaries maintained by the U.S. Geological Survey for the Boundaries data theme of
- 4 The National Map.

# 1 ALASKA NATIVE AREA

- 2 A legal entity, administered by Alaska Native Regional Corporations (ANRCs) and recognized by the
- 3 Federal Government, to conduct business and nonprofit affairs of Alaska Natives and their communities
- 4 pursuant to the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1972 (Public Law 92-203, as amended by Public
- 5 Law 94-204). ANRCs are legal corporate entities with boundaries determined in the Alaska Native
- 6 Claims Settlement Act. Twelve ANRCs are geographic entities that cover most of the State of Alaska.
- 7 The Annette Islands Reserve, which is an American Indian Reservation, is excluded from any ANRC.

# AMERICAN INDIAN AREA

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- a) A legal entity with specific boundaries established by treaty, statute, and/or executive order, over
- 3 which a Federally recognized American Indian tribe has jurisdiction. This area is called an American
- 4 Indian reservation, but includes entities with other designations such as pueblo, colony, and community;
- 5 b) A legal entity for which lands are held in trust by the Federal Government for the use and benefit of a
- 6 tribe or individual member of a tribe. This area is called Indian trust land, either tribal or individual; or c)
- A legal entity with specific boundaries established by State statute for a State-recognized American tribe.
- 8 This area is called a State American Indian reservation.
- 9 The exterior boundaries of American Indian areas are defined in final tribal treaties, agreements,
- 10 executive orders, Federal statutes, secretarial orders, or judicial determinations. These entities are known
- 11 as colonies, communities, pueblos, rancherias, ranches, reservations, reserves, villages, Indian
- 12 communities, and Indian villages. The Bureau of Indian Affairs maintains a list of Federally recognized
- tribal governments.

# **BOUNDARY LINE**

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- 2 A bounding limit line of jurisdictional authority for various levels of government. Although not listed
- 3 with each governmental unit or legal entity, an areal boundary feature has a relationship with a line
- 4 defining its limit and may include information about that line.

# 27 **Capture Conditions**

- 28 If BOUNDARY LINE is Disputed or Indefinite,
- 29 Or
- 30 If BOUNDARY LINE is the Mason and Dixon Line of Delaware/Maryland/Pennsylvania/West Virginia
- 31 or the Von Schmidt Line of California/Nevada,
- 32 Then capture.

# Attribute Information

- 34 If a Boundary Line is the Mason and Dixon Line or the Von Schmidt Line, the Boundary Line Status is
- 35 Historical.

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### **BOUNDARY POINT MONUMENT OR REFERENCE POINT** 1

2 An identified monument or reference point that marks location on or near a boundary line.

- If BOUNDARY POINT MONUMENT or REFERENCE POINT is officially accepted by a governmental 13
- 14 unit or legal entity,
- 15 Then capture.

# 1 **COUNTRY**

- 2 A basic geopolitical entity of the world, including the following categories: (a) Independent States; (b)
- 3 Dependent Areas; (c) Areas of quasi-independence, non-contiguous territories, Possessions without
- 4 populations, Areas with special sovereignty associations, or Areas without sovereignty; (d) Political
- 5 regimes not recognized by the United States; and (e) Outlying Areas of the United States. The list of
- 6 basic entities in FIPS PUB 10-4 provides complete coverage of the land areas of the world without
- 7 overlap or duplication.

# COUNTY

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- 2 The first-order subdivisions of each State or equivalent entity, including the parishes of Louisiana; the
- 3 boroughs and census areas of Alaska; the independent cities of Alaska, Maryland, Missouri, Nevada, and
- 4 Virginia; and the portion of Yellowstone National Park in Montana. In the U.S. possessions, entities
- 5 regarded as first-order subdivisions are as follows: American Samoa: districts and islands (the areas
- 6 legally designated as "counties" in American Samoa are second-order subdivisions); Northern Mariana
- 7 Islands: municipalities; Palau: states; Puerto Rico: municipios; and Virgin Islands: islands (comprising
- 8 the three major islands of St. Croix, St. John, and St. Thomas). First-order subdivisions of the Federated
- 9 States of Micronesia are states; and of the Marshall Islands, municipalities. The District of Columbia and
- Guam have no first-order subdivisions, and therefore these same areas serve as both State and county
- 11 equivalents.

# INCORPORATED PLACE

- 2 A populated place that is a legal entity having defined boundaries and legally constituted governmental
- 3 functions and powers. Incorporated places are established in each State, under the laws of their respective
- 4 States. They may also serve as primary county divisions in some States. Examples of incorporated
- 5 places are boroughs (in Connecticut, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania), cities (in 49 States and the District
- of Columbia), municipalities, city, and boroughs (in Alaska), towns (in 30 States and the Virgin Islands),
- 7 and villages (in 20 States and American Samoa).

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Incorporated place also includes:

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• Consolidated City: An incorporated place that has consolidated its governmental function with another level of government, such as city-county or city-town/township consolidations. Examples are: the City and County of Denver in Colorado; the City of Athens and Clarke County in Georgia; the City of Columbus and Muscogee County in Georgia; the City of Indianapolis and Marion County in Indiana; the City of Butte and Silver Bow County in Montana; and the City of Nashville and Davidson County in Tennessee.

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• Independent City: An incorporated place that is not legally part of another county and, therefore, also serves as a county equivalent. In Alaska, Maryland, Missouri, Nevada, and Virginia, there are one or more incorporated places known as "independent cities" that are primary subdivisions of a State. Examples are: Anchorage, Alaska; Baltimore, Maryland; St. Louis, Missouri; Carson City, Nevada; and 39 independent cities in Virginia, ranging from Alexandria to Winchester.

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- **Independent Place**: An incorporated place that is also a primary (or first-order) division of a county. Primary country divisions that are not incorporated places are Minor Civil Divisions.

# MINOR CIVIL DIVISION

- 2 A legal entity that is a subdivision of a county or county equivalent, other than an incorporated place,
- 3 established by appropriate State or local governmental authorities. Minor Civil Divisions (MCDs) are the
- 4 primary governmental or administrative divisions of a county in many States. Examples are barrios,
- 5 boroughs (in each of the five counties that comprise the City of New York), magisterial districts (in
- 6 Virginia and West Virginia), precincts, townships, and towns (in New England States, New York, and
- 7 Wisconsin).

35 36 37	Prison	Area for housing persons convicted and sentenced for crimes; includes correctional institution, detention center, and penitentiary

1 2 3 4 5	Reserve	Area primarily for wildlife management or preservation; includes the following areas: animal farm, conservation, estuarine sanctuary, fish hatchery, game, hunting and fishing, preserve, watershed district, or other "wildlife" designation

- 13 If the Reservation Type is an Ahupuaa in Hawaii, then the Administrative Status is State.
- 14 If the Reservation Type is a Forest or Grassland, then the Name is Alphanumeric.
- 15 If the Reservation Type is a Hawaiian Homestead or Home Land, then the Administrative Status is State.

# 1 **STATE**

- 2 A State or equivalent entity of the United States, the District of Columbia, and the Outlying Areas of the
- 3 U.S. and its Associated Areas, including American Samoa, Federated States of Micronesia, Guam,
- 4 Marshall Islands, Northern Mariana Islands, Palau, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, and U.S. Minor Outlying

Length value: 99

- 5 Islands (Baker Island, Howland Island, Jarvis Island, Johnston Atoll, Kingman Reef, Midway Islands,
- 6 Navassa Island, Palmyra Atoll, and Wake Island).
